#### D. INLAND FLOODING...

LEON, FL...NUMEROUS ROADS FLOODED AROUND LEON COUNTY AND THE GREATER TALLAHASSEE AREA THAT RESULTED IN ROAD CLOSURES AND A FEW ROAD COLLAPSES. TIMBER LAKE SUBDIVISION WAS CUT OFF BY FLOODWATERS DURING THE STORM. THIS AFFECTED 230 HOMES. ONE ESTIMATE PLACES THE NUMBER OF HOMES DAMAGED BY FLOOD WATERS COUNTY WIDE AT 450. FLOODING CONTINUES AS OF 8/28/08 ALONG THE OCHLOCKONEE RIVER AS WELL AS MUNSON SLOUGH. THE CREST AT THE OCHLOCKONEE RIVER AT CONCORD WAS 45.71 FEET. THE CREST AT HAVANA WAS 33.71 FEET. THIS CREST WAS AT THE MAJOR STAGE AND ONLY 1.4 FEET BELOW THE RECORD STAGE.

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WAKULLA, FL...FLOODING ALONG THE SAINT MARKS RIVER AT NEWPORT SET A RECORD WITH A STAGE OF 13.88 FEET...OR 2.1 FEET ABOVE THE PREVIOUS RECORD STAGE. NUMEROUS ROADS WITHIN THE COUNTY WERE FLOODED. THE OCHLOCKONEE RIVER SOUTH OF THE C.H. CORN HYDRO DAM ROSE TO FLOOD STAGE IN THE WESTERN PART OF THE COUNTY. MORE IMPACTS TO FOLLOW IN THE DAYS AHEAD.

GRADY, GA...MORE THAN 700 MILES OF ROADS WERE AFFECTED BY FLOODING. ONE TEENAGER DROWNED IN A FLOODED DRAINAGE DITCH AND ONE ADULT WAS INJURED TRYING TO SAVE HIM. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION ON FLOODING IMPACTS IN THE COUNTY IS STILL BEING COLLECTED.

THOMAS, GA...US HIGHWAY 84 FLOODED NEAR THE GRADY COUNTY LINE. FOUR CARS PASSED GEORGIA STATE PATROL ROAD BLOCKS AND WERE SWEPT AWAY IN THE FLOOD WATERS ON THE HIGHWAY. ALL SIX OCCUPANTS OF THE CARS WERE RESCUED. NO INJURIES OR FATALITIES WERE REPORTED. ADDITIONAL IMPACTS IN THE COUNTY STILL TO COME.
