Heavy rains resulted in already high lake levels worsening. A rise of the Greenways playa lake resulted in flooding of residential areas along 77th Avenue. 5 families experienced flooding of water well which rendered their water and sewage systems inoperable. All 5 families left their homes and were helped by the Red Cross.

Isolated thunderstorms developed in an environment favorable for localized flooding during the afternoon of the 20th. High atmospheric moisture and slow storm motions were present. By evening thunderstorms became more widespread and moved eastward across mainly the southern portions of the Texas Panhandle. The city of Amarillo experienced flash flooding during the late evening as heavy rainfall resulted in 1 to 3 inches of rain across the city, with locally higher amounts. The highest amount was received from a CoCoRaHS observer in Bishop Hills of 4.83 inches. Area playa lakes were already experiencing high levels due to periodic heavy rainfall during the spring and summer. The heavy rainfall during the evening of the 20th caused playa lake levels to rise rapidly. Homes along 77th Avenue were impacted beginning shortly before midnight. Other playa lakes that flooded includes McDonald lake and Lawrence lake.

A wind gust of 59 mph was measured by the Automated Weather Observing System at the Mesa Vista Ranch airport located 26 miles northwest of Miami.

An isolated severe thunderstorm produced a wind gust to 59 mph in Roberts County. Other weaker thunderstorms produced strong wind gusts near Borger, Bootleg, and just northwest of Amarillo.

Thunderstorms brought heavy rain and flooding to portions of the Texas Panhandle. During the morning hours, thunderstorms brought some minor flooding to Bushland and Amarillo. Water was reported across Interstate 40 and Hope Road. Flash flooding occurred on Interstate 40 at Georgia and Washington. Some minor street flooding occurred in Perryton.
