Farmers Bounce Back With Help From N.E. Iowa

FAYETTE—The Fayette County Extension Service will set a date for a meeting to help farmers make major plans to restore livestock on their farms. The announcement was made by Mel Wangness, extension director.

According to Wangness, the first job facing those farmers who were hit by the May 15 tornado is to plant the remainder of beans and corn.

Extension office representatives visited damaged farms over the weekend and prepared work to assist in the cleanup. The first job accomplished was cleaning up fields and mending fences.

Students from West Central and the Oelwein Vocational Agriculture department helped in the work. A group of farmers from the Brethren church, Orange Township in Waterloo, worked three days.

Bus loads of students from Fayette, and North High schools worked in the fields.

ASCS employes from Johnson, Linn, Jones, Muscatine, Delaware, Clayton, and Fayette counties were working in the damaged areas. The volunteer help also included numerous neighbors and friends.

Sale Date Set For \$1-Million Indee Bond Sale

INDEPENDENCE (Special) — Independence Community School board met Tuesday evening and approved a proposed plan by Junior High Principal Henry Anderson to have 20, 6th, 7th, and 8th-grade students meet one week in June to make changes in the curriculum for the fall school year.

Sixth and seventh grade students from South Attendance Center will attend classes in Independence during the coming year, in preparation for changes which will be brought about when the new middle school is constructed in the near future. Two teacher aides will be hired to assist with supervisory and clerical duties. Two years of college preparation will be required and salary has been set at \$1.70 per hour.

The board passed a resolution approving advertising sales of \$1,100,000 bonds to finance construction of the new middle school. The sale was set for Tuesday, June 11, 2:00 p.m. at the Administration Building.

Board members discussed the summer reading program and ap-

proved the hiring of two senior and junior high teachers and four elementary teachers for the six week program.

About 12 census takers will be hired to take the school census before July 1. Salaries were set at 10c per name for urban areas, and 20c per name and 7c per mile in rural areas.

In other action the board approved the hiring of a 3rd instrumental music instructor; set the next board meeting for June 4 rather than June 10; approved the

continued operation of a pre-first grade class under the instruction of Mrs. Duane Gray; approved contracts for four driver education teachers for an 8-week period during the summer. They were Joe Campbell, Richard Engen, Carlyn Rix and Tom Sheets, and their salary was set at \$1280 each.

The board also accepted the resignations of Mrs. Robert Titsworth, Junior High social studies teacher, and Connie Gaard, kindergarten teacher.
