


Spring Storm Winding Down



Mountains/Higher Foothills: 2-4 inches of additional accumulations possible


Mountain Valleys: Additional accumulation up to one inch

Palmer Divide: 1-2 inches additional accumulation possible

Denver Metro: Additional accumulation up to one inch

Plains: 1-3 inches of additional accumulation possible
