



# Key Points

- **Snow:**
  - Mountains above 9000 feet: Periods of Heavy Snow and Blowing Snow with 8-18", and >2 feet North of Rabbit Ears Pass
  - Foothills above 8000 feet and high mountain valleys: Periods of snow with 2-5" accumulation. Some blowing snow Wednesday
  - Lower Elevations & Eastern Plains: Scattered snow showers this evening and again Wednesday afternoon/evening
- **Main Threats:**
  - Hazardous Mountain travel due to low visibility in falling, blowing, and drifting snow, along with snow covered roads
  - Significant travel delays possible
  - Worst conditions Late Tuesday AM – Tuesday evening, and then again Wednesday afternoon – early Wednesday evening
