

Overall, temperatures were slightly above normal in August, across the Denver area, with below normal precipitation. Official rainfall at Denver (measured at DIA) was 4.12" which was 2.54" above normal. However, most of the Denver metro area had below normal rainfall with Denver Central Park receiving 0.63" of rain while Centennial Airport only had 0.40" of rain.

The average mean temperature at Denver was 73.8 degrees which was 0.9 degrees above normal. Meanwhile, there were episodes of heavy rain and severe weather over the eastern plains during the month.



Monthly Temperature Data (August)

- → Temperatures were slightly above normal in Denver this month. Denver's mean temperature was 73.8°F, which was 0.9°F above normal.
- → The highest temperature for the month was 99°F on the 7th, and the lowest temperature was 51°F which occurred on the 11th.
- → A record high temperature of 99 degrees was tied on the 7th.

Monthly Precipitation/Snowfall (August)

- → Precipitation for August 2025 was 4.12" which was 2.54" inches above the normal of 1.58". This was the 3rd wettest August on record.
- → No snow was observed, which is the normal August snowfall.
- → "Three" daily precipitation records were observed this month on the 10th (1.43"), 26th (1.38") and 29th (0.69").






Statewide Temperature August 2025






Statewide Precipitation August 2025








Statewide Precipitation August 2025


Snowfall during the month of August (Records since 1882)




Drought Conditions Colorado
