.AT 1000 AM CDT...THE CENTER OF TROPICAL STORM DOLLY WAS LOCATED NEAR LATITUDE 24.0 NORTH...LONGITUDE 94.5 WEST OR ABOUT 230 MILES...370 KM...SOUTHEAST OF BROWNSVILLE.

DOLLY IS MOVING TOWARD THE NORTHWEST NEAR 12 MPH...19 KM/HR. A GENERAL NORTHWEST TO WEST-NORTHWEST TRACK IS EXPECTED DURING THE NEXT 24 HOURS WITH ADDITIONAL SLOWING OF FORWARD SPEED. THIS MOTION WOULD BRING THE CORE OF DOLLY NEAR THE MOUTH OF THE RIO GRANDE RIVER ON WEDNESDAY.

DOLLY IS EXPECTED TO PRODUCE TOTAL RAIN ACCUMULATIONS OF 4 TO 8 INCHES...WITH ISOLATED AMOUNTS OF 15 INCHES...OVER MUCH OF THE LOWER RIO GRANDE VALLEY AND NORTHEASTERN MEXICO OVER THE NEXT FEW DAYS.

OUTER RAIN BANDS COULD BEGIN MOVING ACROSS COMMUNITIES AWAY FROM THE COAST PERHAPS AS SOON AS NOON...AND COULD BRIEFLY BECOME MORE NUMEROUS TOWARD EVENING...FOLLOWED BY A BREAK. WIDESPREAD RAINFALL IS EXPECTED TO MOVE IN AFTER MIDNIGHT. RAINS THIS AFTERNOON WILL BE BRIEF BUT HEAVY...AND NO FLOODING IS EXPECTED.

PERSONS LIVING NEAR OR IN POOR DRAINAGE LOCATIONS SHOULD PREPARE FOR POSSIBLE EVACUATION LATER TODAY. IN THESE AREAS...SIGNIFICANT PROPERTY DAMAGE WILL OCCUR...AND SOME POWER OUTAGES ARE LIKELY. MINOR PROPERTY DAMAGE IS POSSIBLE ELSEWHERE.
