


An X inside this box indicates that no flooding occurred within this hydrologic service area.

The entire month of November featured below normal precipitation. There was no flooding on any of the area rivers or streams. None of our rivers had significant crests.

There were some light precipitation events, though none were significant. One of the heavier rainfall events was on November 12th. A strong cold front crossed the forecast area and brought heavy rain to the North Country. Most of the region had around a quarter of an inch to almost an inch of rainfall. This precipitation event accounted for most of the rainfall during the entire month.
