
NEW Highlights

- → Hot and humid today and Friday but rain chances are low, less than 10 percent.
- → Watching a cold front for Saturday which could produce strong to severe thunderstorms. Confidence is low.
- → Continued warm and humid Sunday and into next week with generally low rain chances until Wednesday.






National Forecast - Today




High pressure and upper ridging keep the region dry today. It will be hot and humid with peak heat index values around 90 degrees.



Satellite - Southeast





What This Means


- This level of heat affects most individuals sensitive to heat, especially those without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration



National Forecast - Saturday




A cold front approaches from the north and west. Isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms possible, a few of which may become strong to severe.






Severe Weather Outlook

Day 4-7 Forecast




A stalled cold front may produce a few showers or thunderstorms Sunday through Tuesday, but the next significant chance of rain should hold off until Wednesday.





Current Drought Conditions





Recent heavy rainfall has significantly improved drought conditions across the forecast area, though a few areas of abnormally dry conditions remain.
