


Dangerous Winter Weather Late Today into Tuesday

Moderate/Heavy Snow with Widespread Blowing/Drifting Snow Expected

SNOW
4-8 inches possible along the I-80 Corridor. Includes Laramie, Cheyenne and Sidney. Higher amounts in the Mtns.

POTENTIAL IMPACTS
Blowing/drifting snow with low visibilities. Icy and snow packed roads expected tonight and Tuesday.
