Yet another winter system impacted Southeast Michigan during the morning of Wednesday February 5th. Snow actually developed during the late evening hours on the 4th. The snow increased in intensity during the morning of the 5th. Unfortunately, the snow intensified during the morning commute. In addition to the snow, gusty winds led to considerable blowing and drifting. Needless to say, roads become snow covered and extremely slippery. The snow was the result of a storm system which moved across the Ohio Valley and into New York state. This storm system dropped heavy snow from Kansas and Missouri, across the Ohio valley and southern Great Lakes and into the Northeast. Four to eight inches of snow fell along and south of I-69 corridors, highest amounts toward the Ohio border. Here are a few of the higher snowfall totals reported:

Monroe... 8 inches.

Romulus (Detroit Metro Airport)... 8 inches.

Ypsilanti... 7.8 inches.
