Based on reports from the public and from a storm survey conducted by National Weather service personnel, it was determined that a weak tornado touched down briefly in Clinton County. The tornado touched down in a shallow ravine near the intersection of State Route 134 and Horseshoe Road where it knocked down a few small trees and large branches. In addition, two small windows were broken on a barn.
