Several power outages occurred countywide. Trees were reported down on Ohio 66, Fair and Kuther Roads (3 SW Sidney), Kirkwood-Miami River Road (4 SSW Sidney), and Miami-Shelby East Road. Power poles were reported either leaning or downed in the village of Anna.

Several counties in west central and portions of central ohio experienced damage to trees and power lines due to synoptic wind. A cold front associated with low pressure over the Great Lakes region produced strong winds behind it, averaging 25 to 35 mph with higher gusts.
