



August Precipitation Highlights

- August 2025 was on the dry side with most locations seeing 1-3 inches below normal rainfall. At Springfield, it was the 2nd driest August on record (0.16") dating back to 1878.
- Precipitation patterns were most active during the middle of August. Lincoln set a daily record rainfall of 1.88 inches on August 12th.
- Severe weather was rather limited in central and southeast IL during August. The strongest storms occurred between August 15-20th with mostly minor damage to crops, trees, and structures.






August Temperature Highlights

- Monthly average temperatures were generally near normal for August 2025. A brief heat wave occurred from August 15-18th and brought highs in the low to mid 90s with afternoon heat indices topping 100 degrees on multiple days.
- Otherwise, the heat was balanced by a stretch of cooler weather, too. At Springfield, 2 record low temperatures were broken on consecutive days, Aug. 26 and Aug. 27, when lows dipped down to 44° F and 46° F, respectively.
