



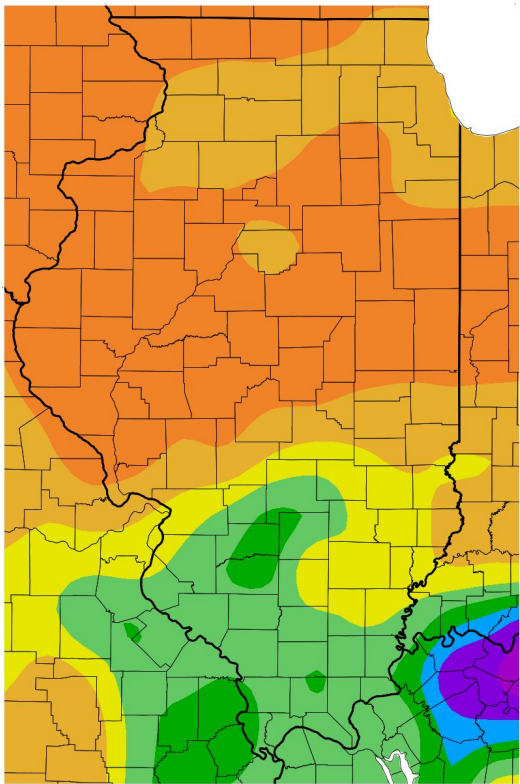

October Precipitation Highlights

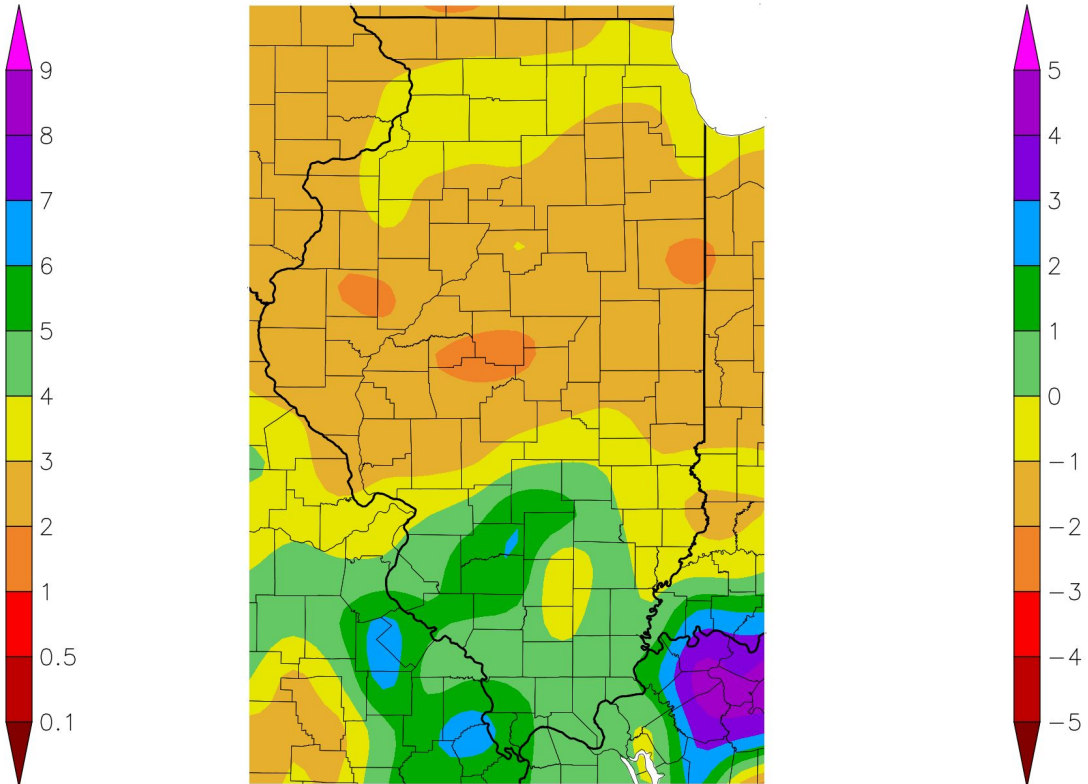
- October 2025 was another dry month with most locations seeing 1-3 inches below normal rainfall.
- Consecutive months of below normal precipitation has led to D1 (moderate) to D2 (severe) drought conditions continuing across most of central Illinois.

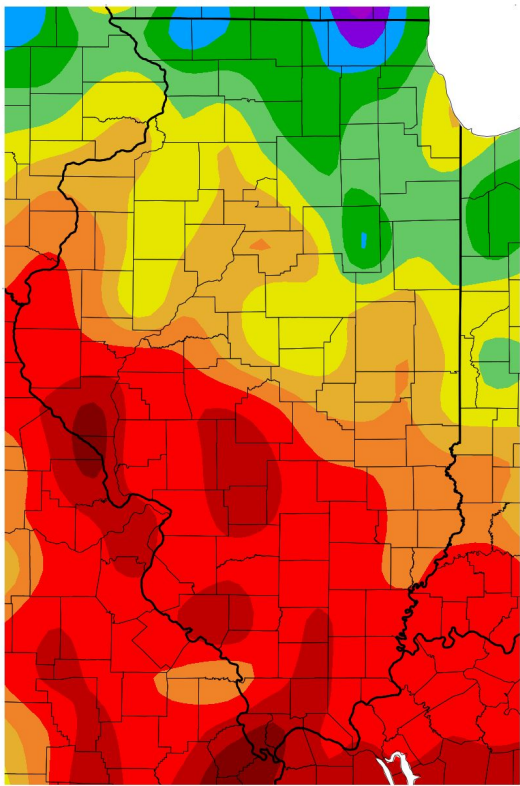
October 2025 Climate Summary

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October Temperature Highlights

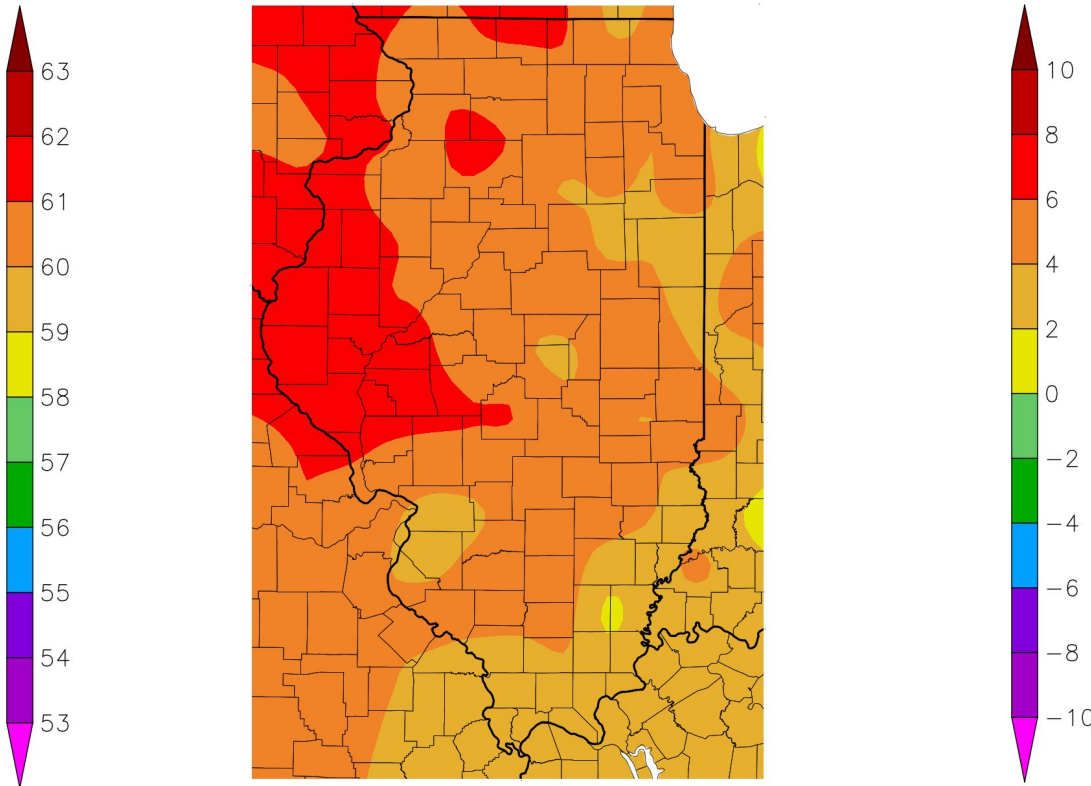
- Temperatures were above normal across the state for the month of October, with most areas in central Illinois running 4-6°F above normal.
- With just a few days exception, temperatures generally ran well above normal with highs in the 80s during the first 18 days of the month. The rest of the month, temperatures were near or slightly below normal.
- Though daily average temperatures were well above normal for the month, neither Peoria nor Springfield finished the month in the top 10 warmest on record.

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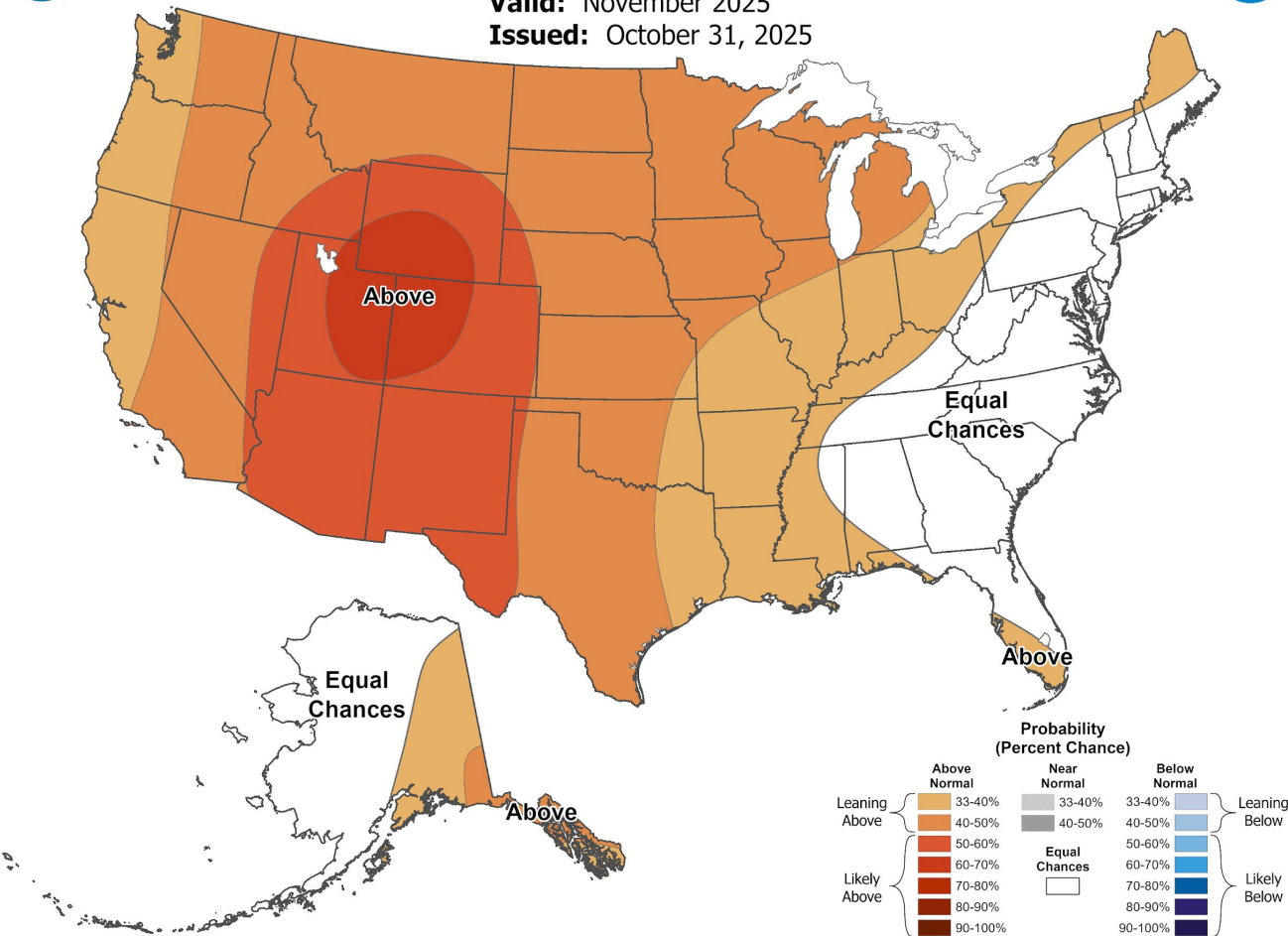
November 2025 Look Ahead
