Snow Accumulations Likely Tonight into Early Thursday Morning

What

- Snow accumulations of 1 to 2 inches, with locally higher amounts possible

Where

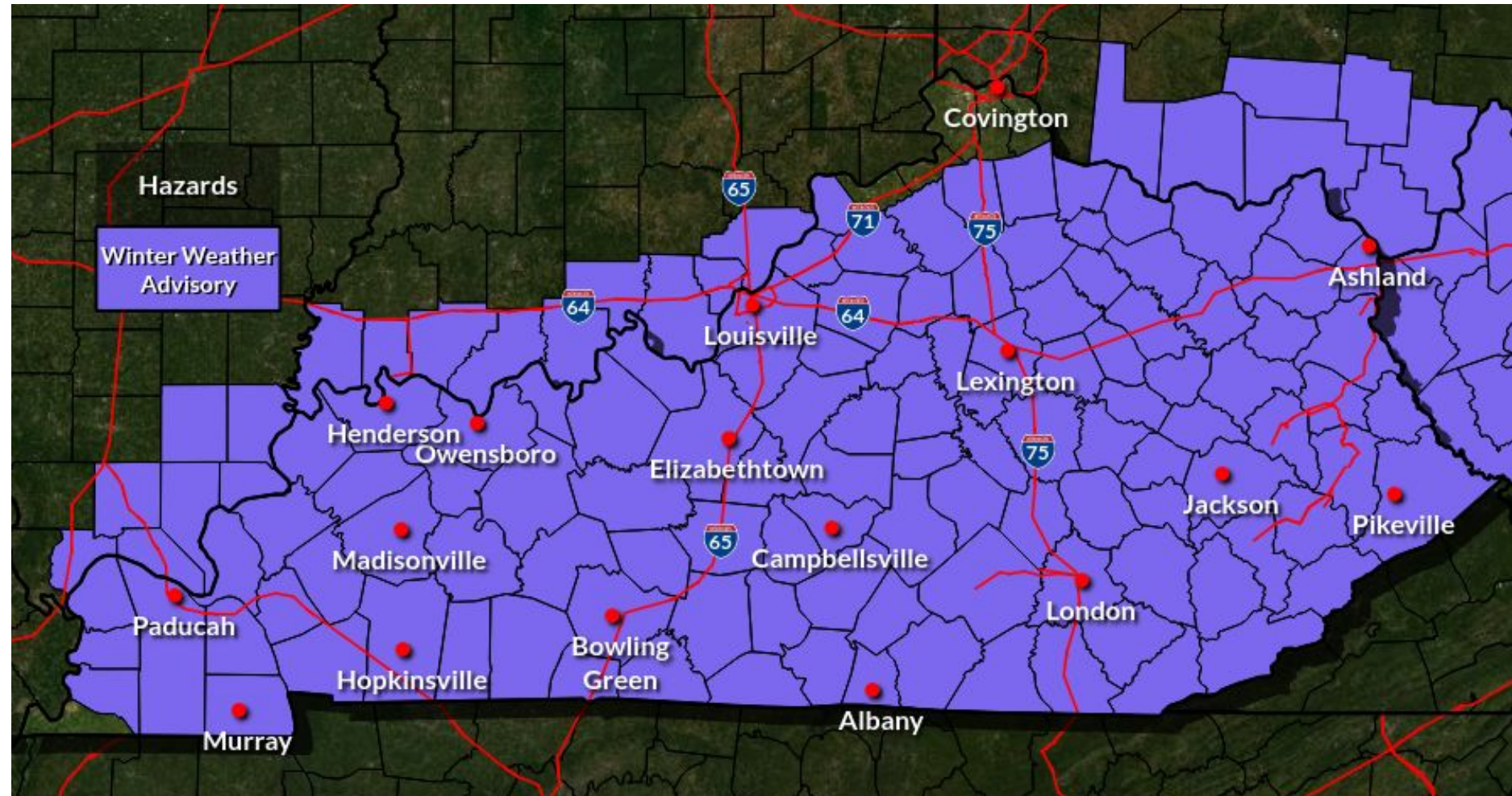
- Portions of Indiana and north central and south central Kentucky

When

- From 7pm EST/6pm CST this evening until 8am EST/7am CST tomorrow morning

Impacts

- Icy or snow covered roads will make for hazardous road conditions for the Thursday morning commute

Snow Accumulations Likely Tonight into Early Thursday Morning

Key Messages

- Rain will continue this afternoon and transition to snow this evening through tonight. A brief wintry mix in between the transition is possible.
- Temperatures will fall from the 40s this afternoon to around 20 by sunrise Thursday morning.

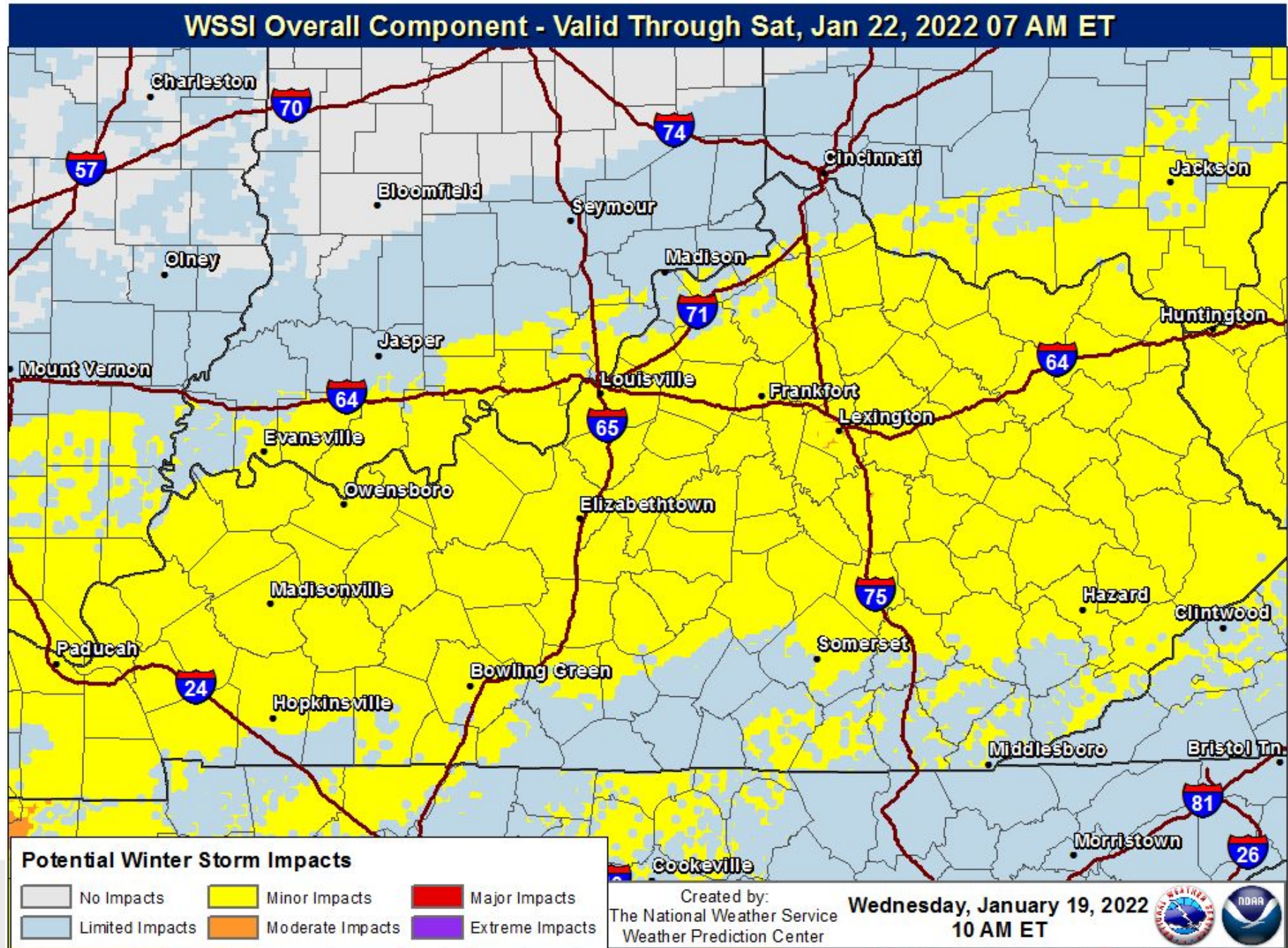
Impacts

Light Showers Across the Region

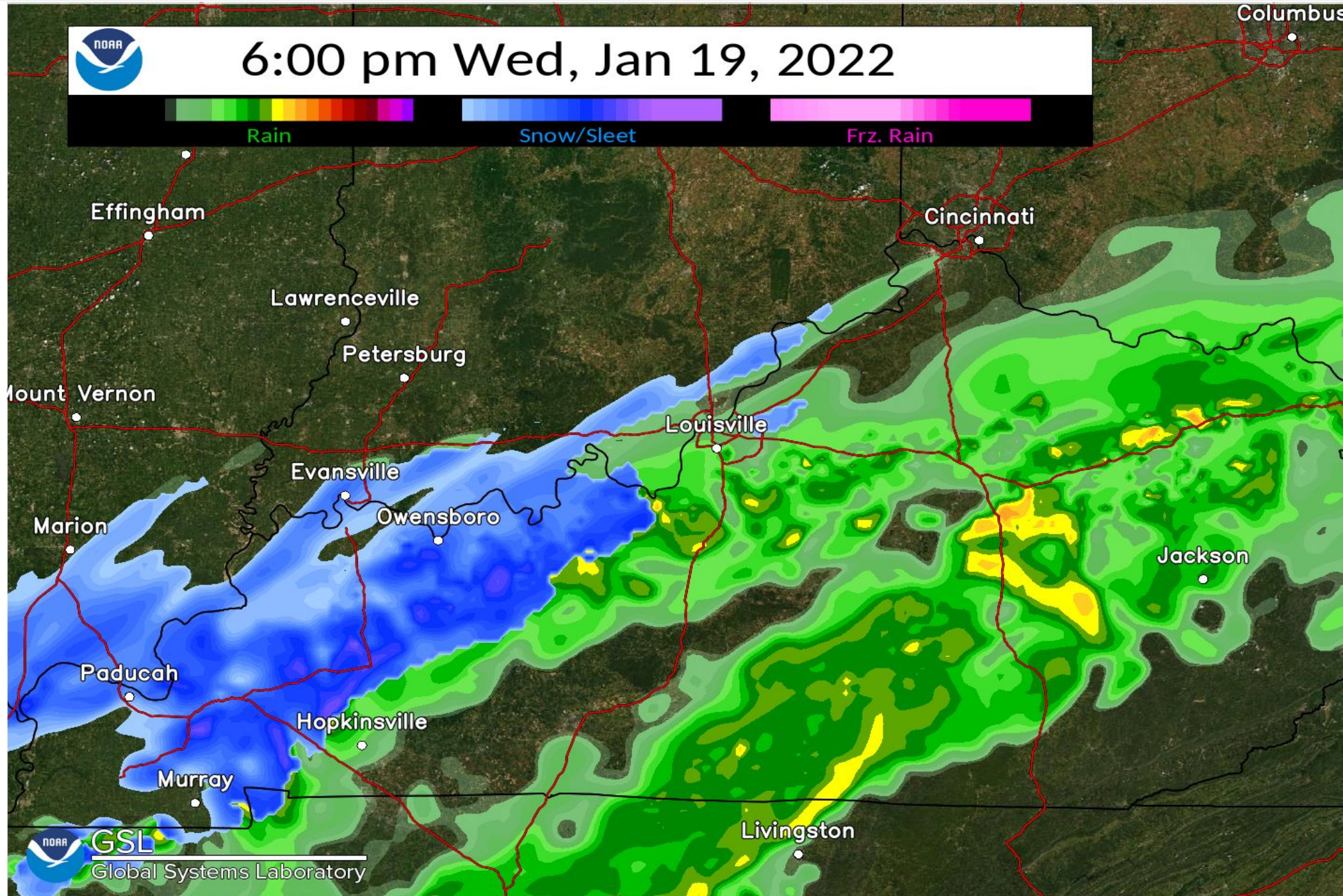

Valid through Thursday morning across the state of Kentucky



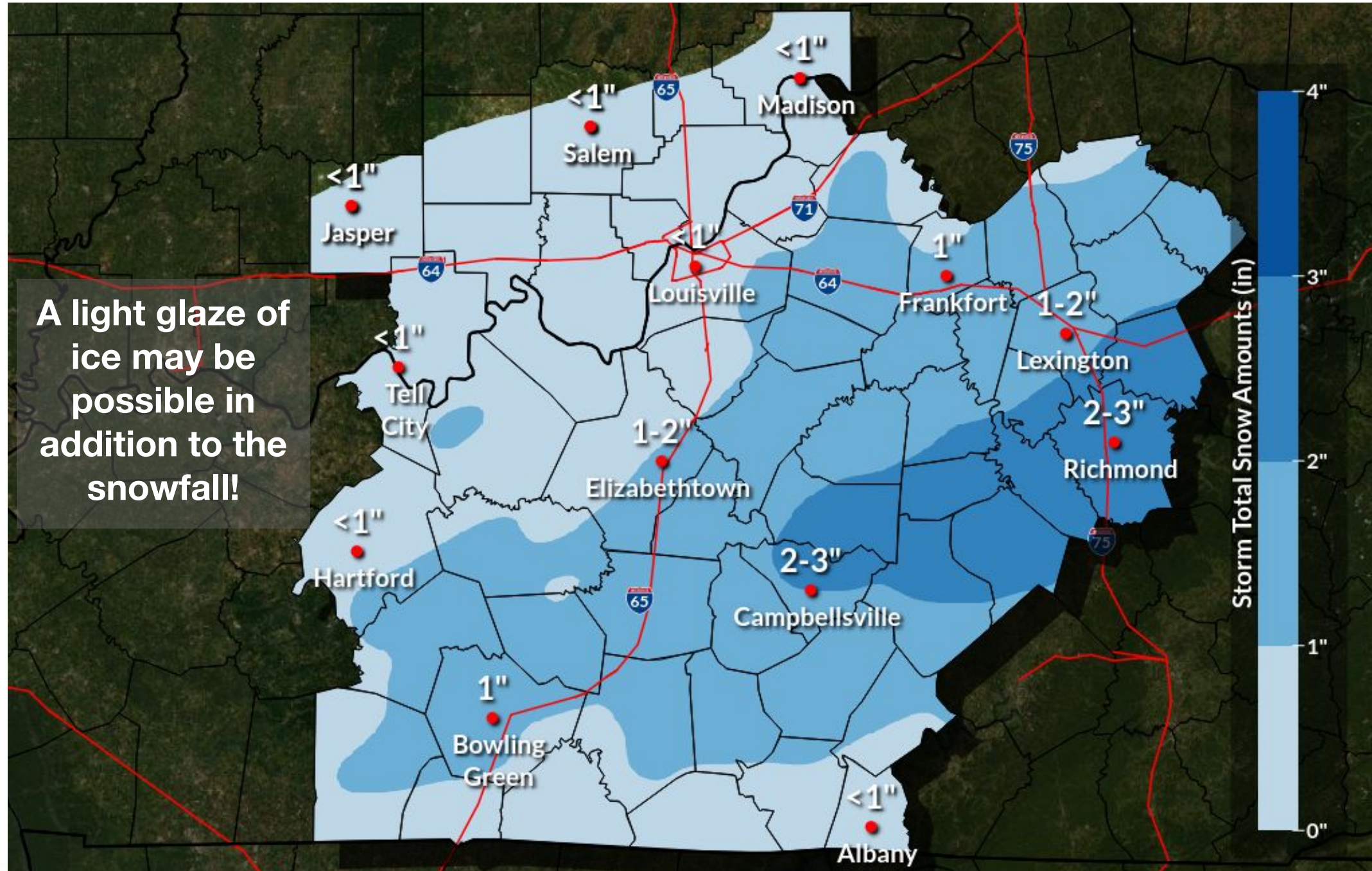
A light glaze of ice may be possible in addition to the snowfall!

Valid through Thursday morning across southern Indiana and central Kentucky

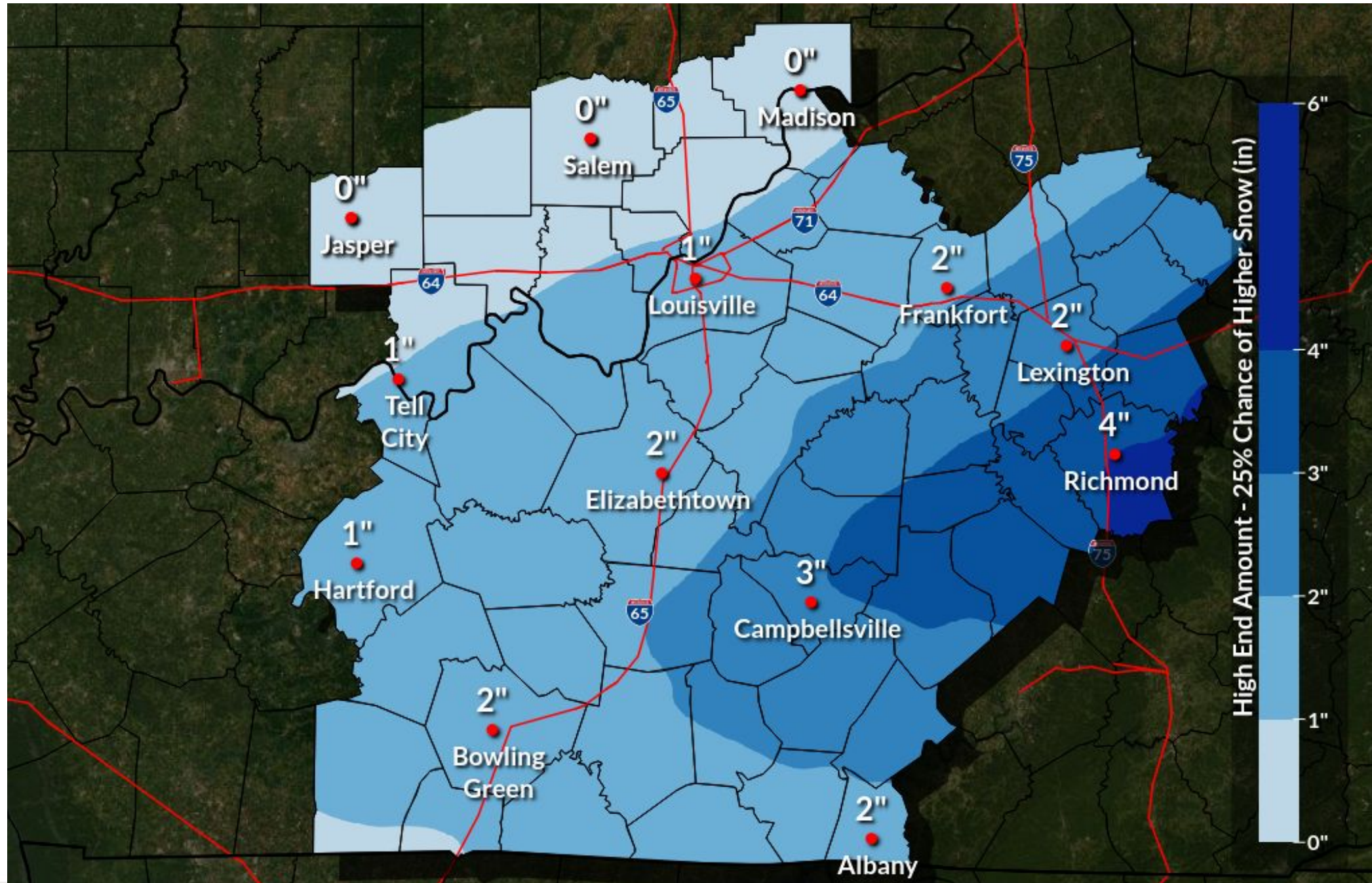




Worst Case Scenario

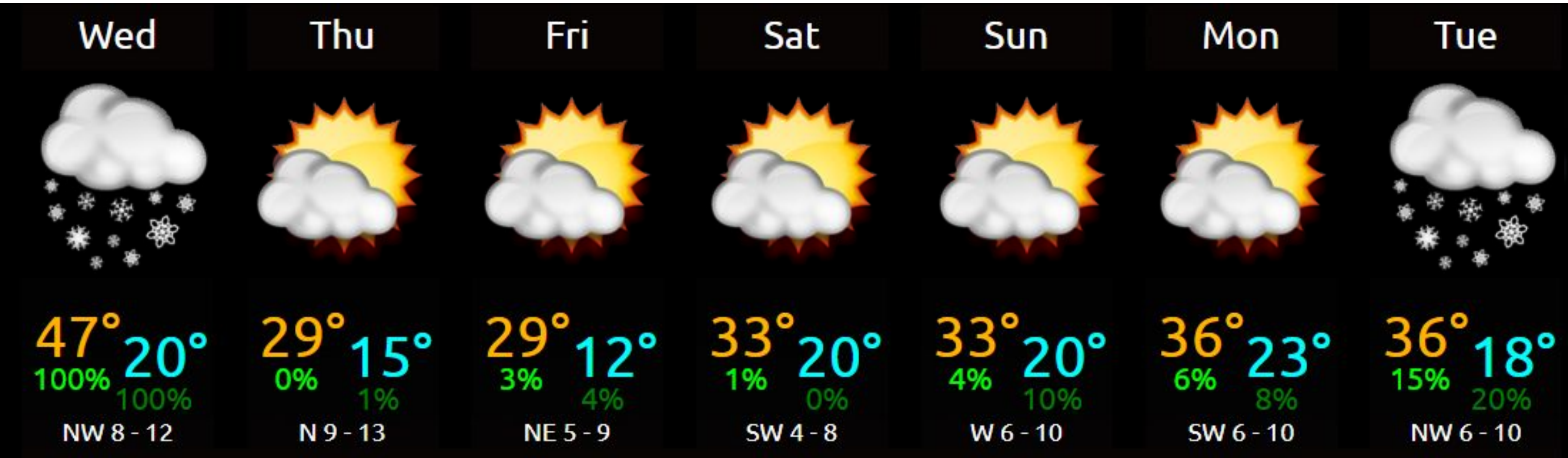
High End Amount
