Transition Tonight

- As warm air moves in, snow will change to a wintry mix including light freezing rain/freezing drizzle which may create a light glaze of ice.
- Precip will change over to rain from south to north late tonight.
- Rain on the snow will create slushy conditions.




Forecast Precipitation Types – Noon Monday

Monday Overview

- A wintry mix in the morning will transition to all rain by afternoon.
- Localized ponding on roadways is possible as rain falls on the snow from Sunday, especially in the Lake Cumberland region, where an inch or more rain may fall.

Summary



Timing:

- Snow continuing to move east across the area
- Heaviest snow ending this evening
- Wintry mix overnight, becoming all rain late AM/early PM

Snow Accumulations:

- 2-4 inches southern Indiana and north central Kentucky north of I-64.
- 4-6 inches central KY with a locally higher amounts over south central KY.

Ice Accumulations:

- Light Freezing Rain/Freezing Drizzle will cause a light glaze of ice overnight especially over south central KY.

Confidence:

- High confidence in timing, amounts, and impacts.
