Need To Know Highlights

- Another round of thunderstorms expected this afternoon into this evening
 - **Wind damage, large hail** (some perhaps in excess of 2 inches in diameter) and **flash flooding** are the main threats. An **isolated tornado** is also possible
- Have a severe weather plan in place and know where to seek shelter when severe storms arrive



Flash Flood Watch In Effect through Wednesday Morning

- Another round of storms today on **saturated grounds** could quickly result in flooding and flash flooding
- Streams and creeks may quickly rise out of banks
- Low-lying crossings and urban areas very susceptible
