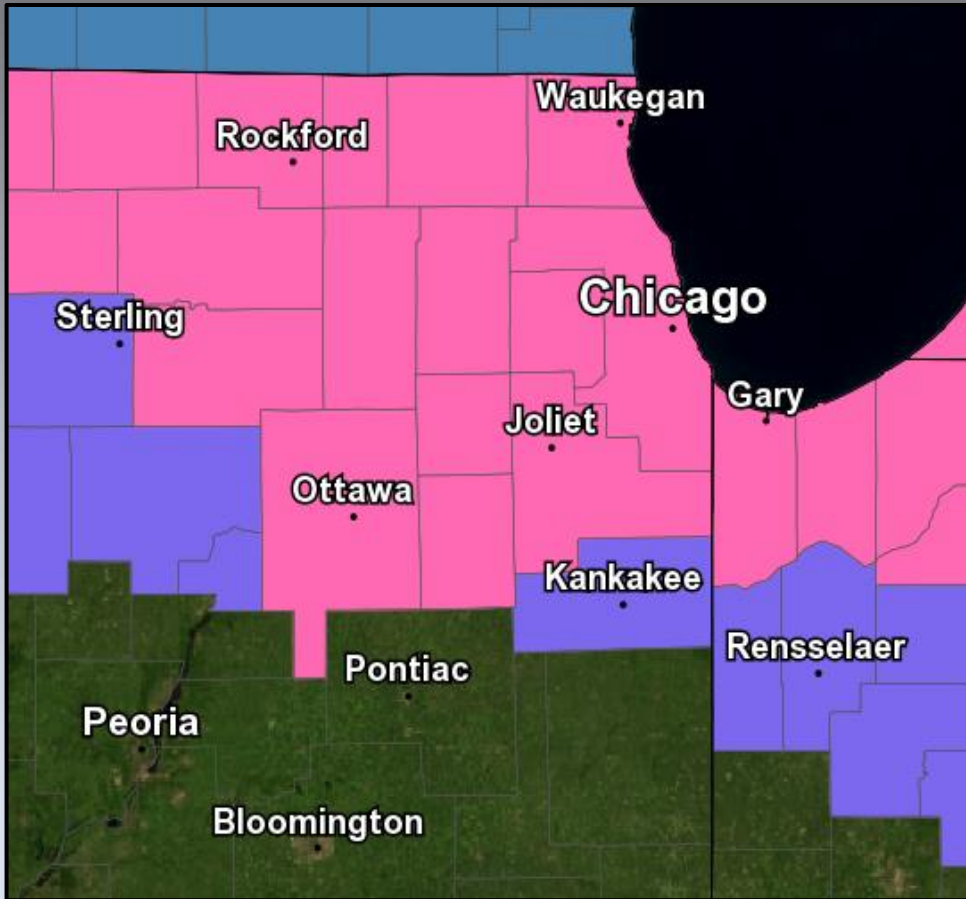

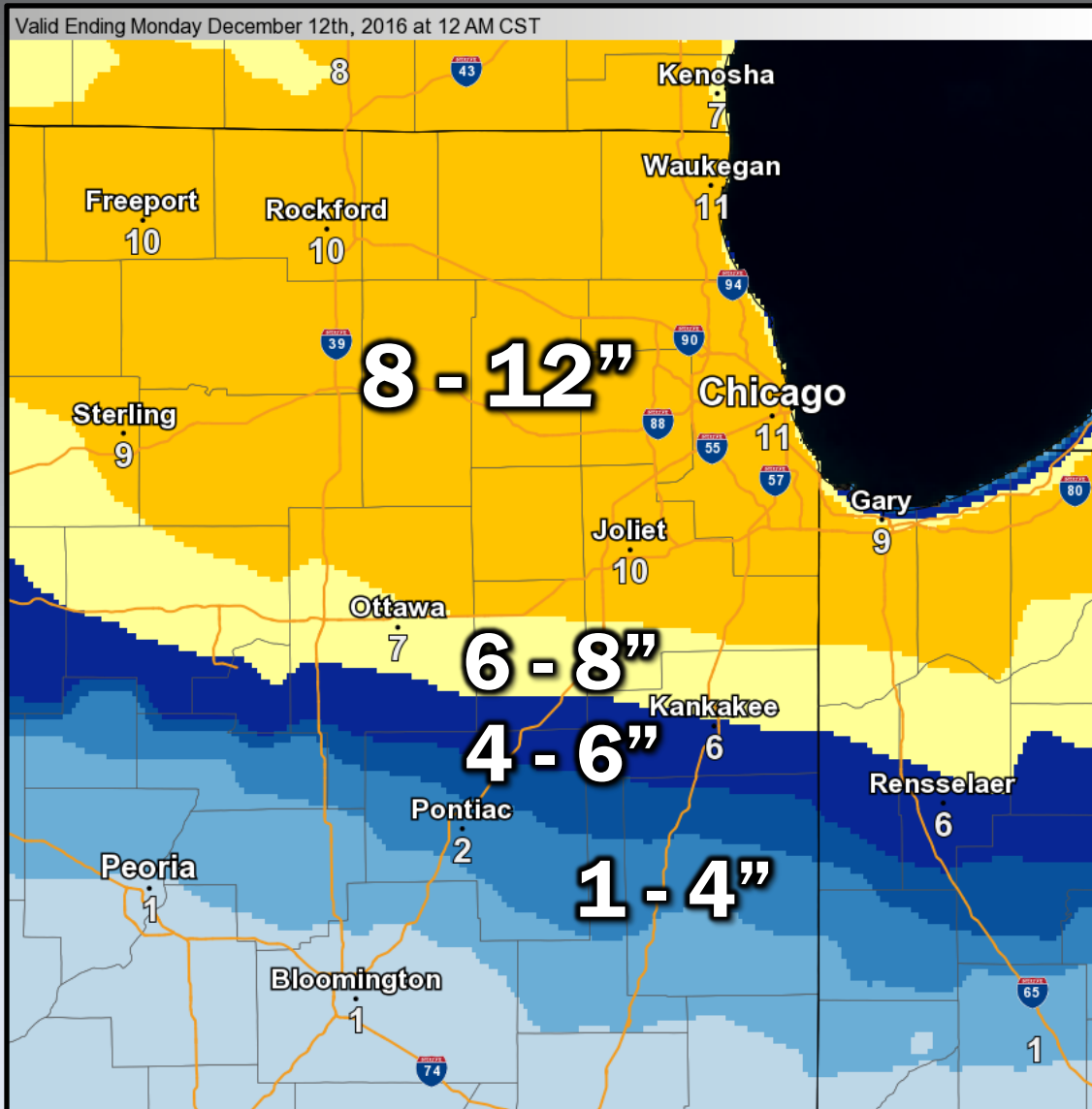


 **Winter Storm Warning**

- Warning area: 6-12" (locally higher possible)
- Advisory: 3-6"
- Chicago: 8-12"
- Rockford: 7-11"
- Far south: 1-3"

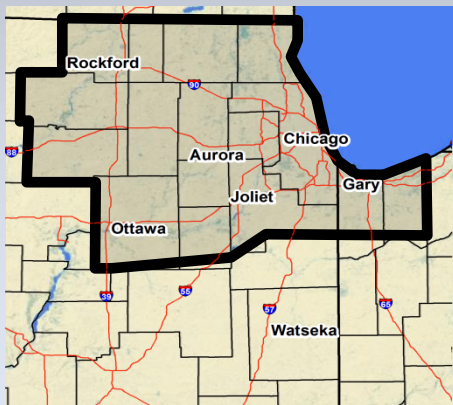

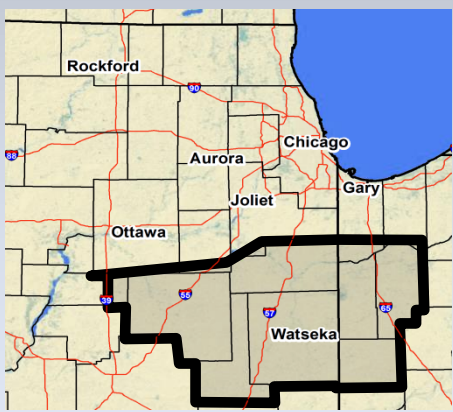

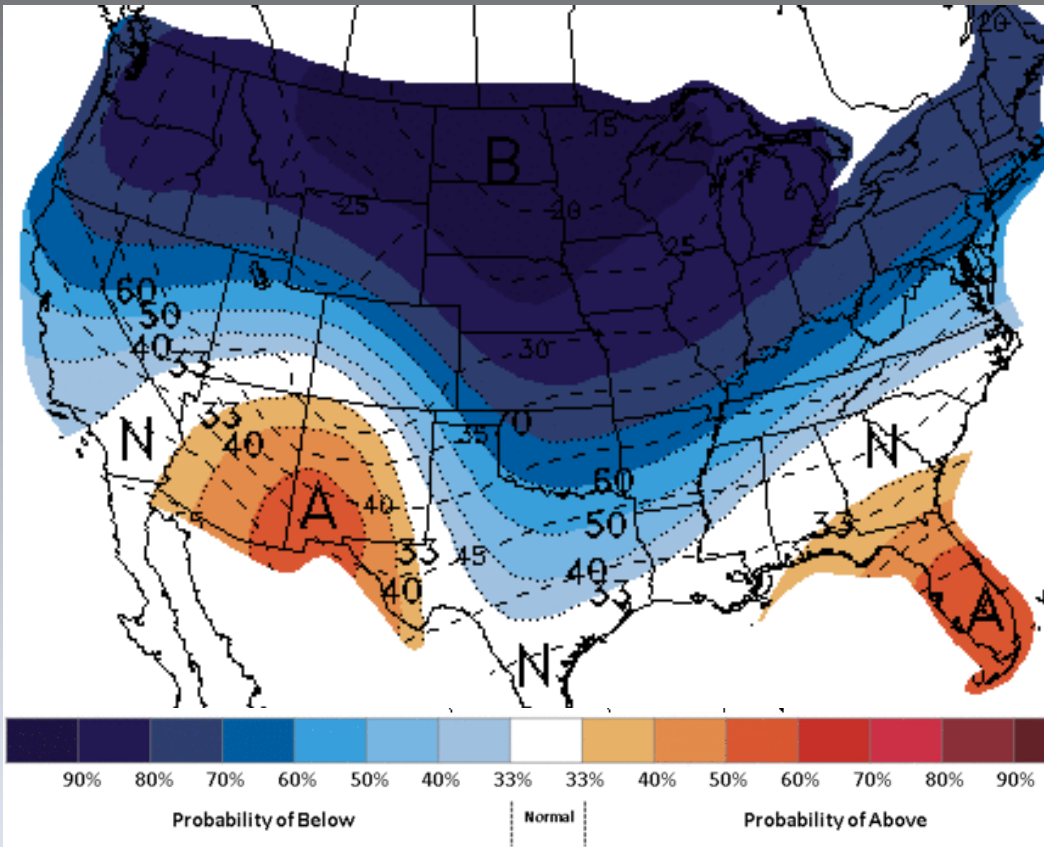
Total snow accumulations 1-6 inches

Dangerous Cold Next Week



- Extended period of sub-zero wind chills likely Tuesday night through Friday morning
- Lowest wind chills, possibly colder than 20 below zero, are expected Wednesday night into Thursday morning
- Wind chills Wednesday and Friday mornings likely to be colder than 10 below zero.

Winter Preparedness



Items to have at home:

- **Flashlight and extra batteries**
- **Battery-powered NOAA Weather Radio and portable radio to receive emergency information**
- **Extra food and water (Have high energy food, such as dried fruit, nuts and granola bars, and food requiring no cooking or refrigeration.)**
- **Extra medicine and baby items**
- **Extra food and water for pets**
- **First-aid supplies**
- **A way to keep warm**

Extreme Cold Safety Tips



- **Keep dry**
- **Wear several layers of lightweight clothing**
- **Cover your head, ears, and lower part of your face**
- **Wear mittens rather than fingered gloves**
- **Watch for signs of frost bite and/or hypothermia**

Road Conditions



Items to have in your car:

- **Mobile phone, charger, batteries**
- **Blankets/sleeping bags**
- **Flashlight with extra batteries**
- **First-aid kit**
- **High-calorie, non-perishable food and water**
- **Extra clothing to keep dry**
- **Sack of sand or cat litter for traction**
- **Shovel & tool kit**
- **Battery booster cables**
- **Compass and road maps**
