
Regional Climate Summary

April 2021

April began with cool and dry conditions as a series of cold fronts kept temperatures at or below normal. Drought relief finally arrived in a big way during the last week of the month. From the 27th through the 30th, multiple rounds of showers and thunderstorms brought heavy rainfall to the drought stricken Permian Basin and southeast New Mexico. Midland International Air and Space Port recorded a new daily rainfall record of 1.49" on the 29th and finished with the month with 2.25". Unfortunately, most locations south of the Pecos River missed out on the beneficial rainfall and finished the month with below normal precipitation.
