
## **Regional Climate Summary**

August 2018

August began with hot, dry, and relatively quiet weather. A pattern change occurred on the 10<sup>th</sup>-11<sup>th</sup> which led to rounds of heavy rain across the Permian Basin. Midland International Air & Spaceport received a record daily rain total of 1.83" on the 11<sup>th</sup>. The Big Bend Region also received significant rainfall which caused minor flooding along the Rio Grande. Another quiet stretch of days with above normal temperatures occurred until the 27<sup>th</sup> when severe storms with 60 mph wind and torrential rain rocked the Midland/Odessa area. To summarize, this August was warmer than normal and very wet in some areas.
