
Regional Climate Summary

Weather Forecast Office Midland/Odessa, TX Issued September 13, 2021 10:42 AM CT



August 2021

It was a very mild August with area temperatures below normal for the 5th month in a row. Remarkably Midland had only one 100°F day. The central Permian Basin was drier than usual, however the monsoon remained very active in western portions of Southeast New Mexico and West Texas to continue the above normal precipitation trend. Monsoonal rainfall on the 12th-14th caused flash flooding and led to a rapid rise in several creeks and draws. The Guadalupe Mountains received an impressive 6 inches of rain during that three day period. Severe thunderstorms produced wind damage in Hobbs and Monahans near the end of the month. Damage to trees and power poles occurred in Hobbs on the 21st with an estimated peak wind speed of 95 mph.
