
## **Regional Climate Summary**

August 2019

The main story for August was the relentless heat that plagued the entire region. All of West Texas and Southeast New Mexico experienced well above normal average temperatures thanks to a persistent dome of high pressure. It was officially the hottest August on record in Midland and many other places experienced near record heat. Many daily high and warm low temperature records were broken including a high of 113°F on the 26<sup>th</sup> at Midland International Airport which shattered the all time August high by 6°F! Not much rain fell this month except for around portions of the lower Trans Pecos and Big Bend region.
