


Regional Climate Summary


December 2019

December was exceptionally warm across most of West Texas and southeast New Mexico. The warmest locations included Fort Stockton, Midland, and Hobbs which all recorded top 10 highest average December temperatures. Precipitation varied greatly regionally from north to south. Only portions of the Davis Mountains, Trans Pecos, and Big Bend National Park received above normal precipitation while the remainder of the region amounted less than 50% of normal precipitation. The wettest locations included Alpine, Crane, Fort Davis, Fort Stockton, and McCamey, which totaled over 1.00" of precipitation for the month, whereas the driest locations were Artesia, Carlsbad, Hobbs, and Seminole which experienced little to no precipitation. Despite the warmth, there was one storm system that brought cold air and around an inch of snow to southeast New Mexico and the Guadalupe and Davis Mountains on the 28th-29th.
