
Regional Climate Summary

February 2018

The main story for February was the continued dryness and worsening drought conditions. It was yet another month without any major storm systems effecting the region. By the end of the month, the majority of our region was in moderate to severe drought. Most locations saw under a tenth of an inch for the month except for areas around Snyder where amounts were near 0.50". As is usually the case this month, temperature swings were large as Spring weather begins to appear. We saw some chilly morning lows including 11°F in Tatum on the 26th. To contrast, temperatures warmed all the way to 95°F at Castolon on the 16th.
