
Regional Climate Summary

January 2018

Weather Forecast Office Midland/Odessa, TX Issued May 13, 2021 2:04 AM CT

Dry and cool weather was the story this January. Temperatures were at or below normal across the area due to a cold start to the month. Many temperature swings occurred throughout the month as storm systems passed north of the region and brought a series of cold fronts through west Texas and southeast New Mexico. A precipitation deficit existed throughout the region with most locations receiving less than a tenth of an inch. Alpine, Midland, and Seminole, TX all recorded their top 10 driest January. No major winter storms occurred and only a few light traces of snow fell during the first week of the month.
