


Regional Climate Summary


January 2021

January began with over a foot of snow covering the ground in the Big Bend and portions of the eastern Permian Basin. Unfortunately, the rest of the Permian Basin missed out on any significant snow accumulation due to the track of this storm system. A second winter storm brought several inches of snow to southeast New Mexico and the northern Permian Basin on the 10th. Areas that received snow experienced a wetter than normal month. January temperatures were at or below normal in most locations. The end of the month turned dry and windy, especially on the 25th and 30th when blowing dust shrouded the sky.
