

Regional Climate Summary

July 2023

Issued August 16, 2023 3:12 PM CT



- Most areas were well below normal precipitation for the month with portions of Scurry County seeing near normal rainfall.
- It was also quite hot for the with all of the region being at least a couple degrees above normal.
- KMAF set its fourth longest stretch of days at or above 100°F with 13 between July 9th and 21st.
- KMAF set one record high (110 °F on July 12th) and five record warm lows (July 9th, 11th, 12th, 13th, and 17th)
- Four days in July featured lows that stayed at or above 80°F, which ties the record for number of such days in a month with June of this year.

- ### Midland Int'l Airport July Statistics:
- Warmest Day: 110°F on the 12th
 - Coldest Night: 66°F on the 2nd
 - Average Temperature: 87.5°F (Normal: 84.4°F)
 - Precipitation Total: .33" (Normal: 1.62")
 - Snowfall Total: 0"
 - Highest Wind Gust: 40 mph on the 6th
