
Regional Climate Summary

November 2020

This November was especially warm and dry across our region, which only served to exacerbated the ongoing drought. The highest category of drought (exceptional) encompassed all of southeast New Mexico and half of West Texas by the end of the month. Average November temperatures ranged from 4 to 8 degrees above normal. Many locations including MAF experienced their top 5 warmest November on record. Cooler weather did arrive during the last week of the month however, with showers and thunderstorms developing across the Trans Pecos and Permian Basin on the 28th. This rainfall was a welcome sight, but only a select few locations received over 0.25". Almost the entire region ended the month with less than 25% of normal precipitation.
