Hot temperatures, relative humidity values below 15 percent, and high winds supported rapid wildfire spread across the Midland county warning area. Fires occurred in Lea County in southeastern New Mexico and in Gaines, Crane, and Howard counties in west Texas. The largest of these fires was a complex that occurred in Howard County near the community of Forsan caused by downed transmission lines. A fire just outside Forsan grew to 10,000 acres while a second fire several miles south of Forsan grew to about

Severe thunderstorm winds blew through Seagraves in northern Gaines County taking down a cell phone tower and blowing a tree onto a house. Several reports of damage were received by police in Seagraves according to the local newspaper. A Texas Tech Mesonet site one mile southwest of Seagraves recorded wind gusts of 74 and 75 mph during the time damage was reported to have occurred.

Several supercells developed on the dryline and propagated northeast across the area. One of these storms became tornadic in Ward
