




Minor Flooding Possible in parts of Potomac River basin

Decision Support Briefing #2 As of: Noon, June 10,2018



What Has Changed?

- Lower rainfall amounts
- Removed flood threat from James basin













Main Points

HAZARD:	River Flooding
IMPACTS:	Minor river flooding is possible due to areas of heavy rain
LOCATION:	Primary threat area at this point is Martinsburg WV and other areas in the middle parts of the Potomac River basin
TIMING:	Heaviest rain in Potomac region is expected beginning this afternoon into the overnight hours. Flood threat time is primarily early Monday morning into Tuesday
NOTES:	This briefing primarily covers larger river flooding. Small stream flooding is possible. Coastal and tidal area flooding is also likely.














Observed Precipitation



- Over 4 inches of rain was recorded in some spots in the Delmarva peninsula in the 24hrs ending at 7am Sunday morning
- ✓ Another area of about 2 inches was recorded near Richmond VA
- ✓ Amounts in the Potomac River basin were generally light although a few localized spots near an inch

Middle Atlantic River Forecast Center








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Forecast Precipitation



- Heaviest Rain is forecast is for up to 2 inches from central Pennsylvania across western Maryland and the West Virginia panhandle.
- ✓ This includes much of the Potomac River headwaters
- Heaviest rains are no longer expected in the James River basin

 Flash flood watches are currently in effect in the areas shown












River Forecasts

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- Opequon River at Martinsburg WV is expected to reach minor flood levels overnight
- Other areas may approach minor flood levels
- Moderate flooding is possible but not expected at this time if heavier rainfall bands set up
 - Many areas of coastal and tidal flooding also expected






