


*****MINOR TO MODERATE FLOODING THIS WEEK*****

Warmup Continues into Tuesday continuing snowmelt across the Tug Hill Plateau, the Adirondacks, the Green and White Mountains, and the snow covered areas of Maine.


Additionally, rainfall is forecast between 1 and 2 inches across the NERFC basins in the next 48 hours.

Current streamflows are in the normal to above normal range...with ice affecting interior and northern Maine gages.

Over 40 locations are forecast to rise to MINOR flood levels with several locations forecast to MODERATE flood levels.




Significant River Flood Outlook
