2 - SLIGHT (SLGT)

Scattered
severe storms
possible

Short-lived and/or
not widespread,
isolated intense
storms possible

3 - ENHANCED (ENH)

Numerous
severe storms
possible

More persistent
and/or widespread,
a few intense

4 - MODERATE (MDT)

Widespread
severe storms
likely

Long-lived,
widespread and
intense




- One or two tornadoes
- Reports of strong winds/wind damage
- Hail ~1", isolated 2"



- A few tornadoes
- Several reports of wind damage
- Damaging hail, 1 - 2"



- Strong tornadoes
- Widespread wind damage
- Destructive hail, 2" +








Decision Support Briefing Highlights



What	Where	Timing	Confidence
Isolated Tornadoes	Southwest of Saline to Pawnee Counties	6 pm through 10 pm	Low confidence
Large Hail	All of southwest Iowa and eastern Nebraska Significant hail (>2") possible in southeast Nebraska	3 pm today through 1 am Wednesday	High confidence
Damage Winds	South of a line from Seward to Lincoln to Nebraska City	6 pm through 10 pm	Moderate confidence
Isolated Flooding	Southeast Nebraska	3 pm today through 7 am Wednesday	Low confidence

Day 1 Precipitation Forecast – valid 7 am Tue to 7 am Wed



Some Final Points

- Thunderstorms are expected to move from north-central Kansas into southeast Nebraska after 3 pm.
- The storms will spread northeast across the remainder of eastern Nebraska and southwest Iowa this evening into tonight.
 - The tornado threat appears to be decreasing, but an isolated tornado or two still appears possible in a small part of southeast Nebraska.
 - Large hail appears to be the main threat. Some very large, greater than 2 inches in diameter.
 - Isolated wind damage is possible in southeast Nebraska.
 - Isolated locally heavy rainfall is likely with the thunderstorms.
- Additional severe weather is possible on Wednesday
