




# Heavy Snow and Strong Winds Today



Decision Support Briefing #4
As of: 1200 pm January 4, 2018



### What's Changed?

- Winter Storm Warning expanded into Orange and Passaic Counties.
- Upgrade to Storm Warning for the local ocean water out 20 nautical miles.










# **Probabilistic Snowfall Forecasts**

### Expected Snowfall - Official NWS Forecast Valid: 01/04/2018 11:00 AM - 01/05/2018 01:00 AM

# **Strong Winds**



### **Strong Wind Threat**

- ✓ Gusts 30 to 45 mph for much of the Region
- ✓ Gusts 45 to 55 mph for Long Island and SE Connecticut

### Timing and Location

✓ Into Tonight

### **Impacts**

- Reduced visibility from blowing and drifting snow
- ✓ Potential for downed tree limbs, power lines and scattered power outages












# **Dangerous Cold**



### **Wind Chills**

- √ -5 to -15 F Late Tonight into Friday Morning
- √ -10 to -20 F Late Friday Night into Saturday Morning

### **Impacts**

✓ Frostbite and Hypothermia threat from prolonged exposure









# **Forecast Uncertainties and Scenarios**

- ✓ High confidence on a major snow and wind storm affecting the region today
- Western extent of heavy snow banding
  - Expected to stall near NYC/NJ metro and Hudson River, but could shift east to west by 10 to 20 miles
- ✓ Location and duration of heavy snow banding across LI and CT
  - Snowfall could locally be a few inches higher or lower than forecast









# **Event Summary**

- ✓ 8 to 12 inches of snow expected for Long Island, and southern Connecticut, with potential for locally higher amounts.
  - ✓ Snowfall rates of 1 to 2 "/ hr
  - ✓ Blizzard Conditions expected over Suffolk County
- √ 5 to 10 inches of snow expected for NYC/NJ metro, and most of the Lower Hudson Valley and Northeastern New Jersey .
- ✓ 30 to 55 mph wind gusts this morning into tonight may down some tree limbs and powerlines, as well as cause blowing and drifting of snow. Strongest winds across Long Island.
- ✓ Gale to Storm Conditions on the nearshore waters today. Gales continue through Friday Night
- Dangerously cold wind chills likely early Friday Morning and early Saturday morning


