	The most extensive damage occurred in Omega in Kingfisher County and in Okarche on the Canadian/Kingfisher County line. In both of these towns structures were destroyed along with widespread tree and power line damage.								
	Other wind damage was reported in Concho and El Reno in Canadian County, in Kingfisher and Loyal in Kingfisher County, southeast of Waynoka in Woods County, in Fairview and north-northeast of Chester in Major County. Wind gusts estimated at 75 mph downed large tree limbs east of Pauls Valley in Garvin County.								
	After thunderstorms repeatedly moved through central Oklahoma, flash flooding occurred in Norman in Cleveland County. Also, lightning struck and set fire to a house in Edmond in Oklahoma County.

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Severe thunderstorms moved across a large part of western, central, and southern Oklahoma during the afternoon of August 11th. Large hail, severe wind damage, and 2 tornados were reported.

The first tornado, and F1, occurred in Walters in Cotton County and the second tornado, an F0, was spotted north of Ringling in Jefferson County.

Hail as large as golf balls fell in Dewey County in Aledo, in Custer County northwest of Custer City, and in Stephens County in Marlow and north of Duncan. In Washita County, golf ball sized hail was reported south of Canute, in Burns Flat, and in Foss. Major hail damage was also reported in Foss.

Severe thunderstorm winds as high as 84 mph were measured at the Oklahoma mesonet site east-northeast of Willow in Washita County and northwest of Martha in Jackson County.
