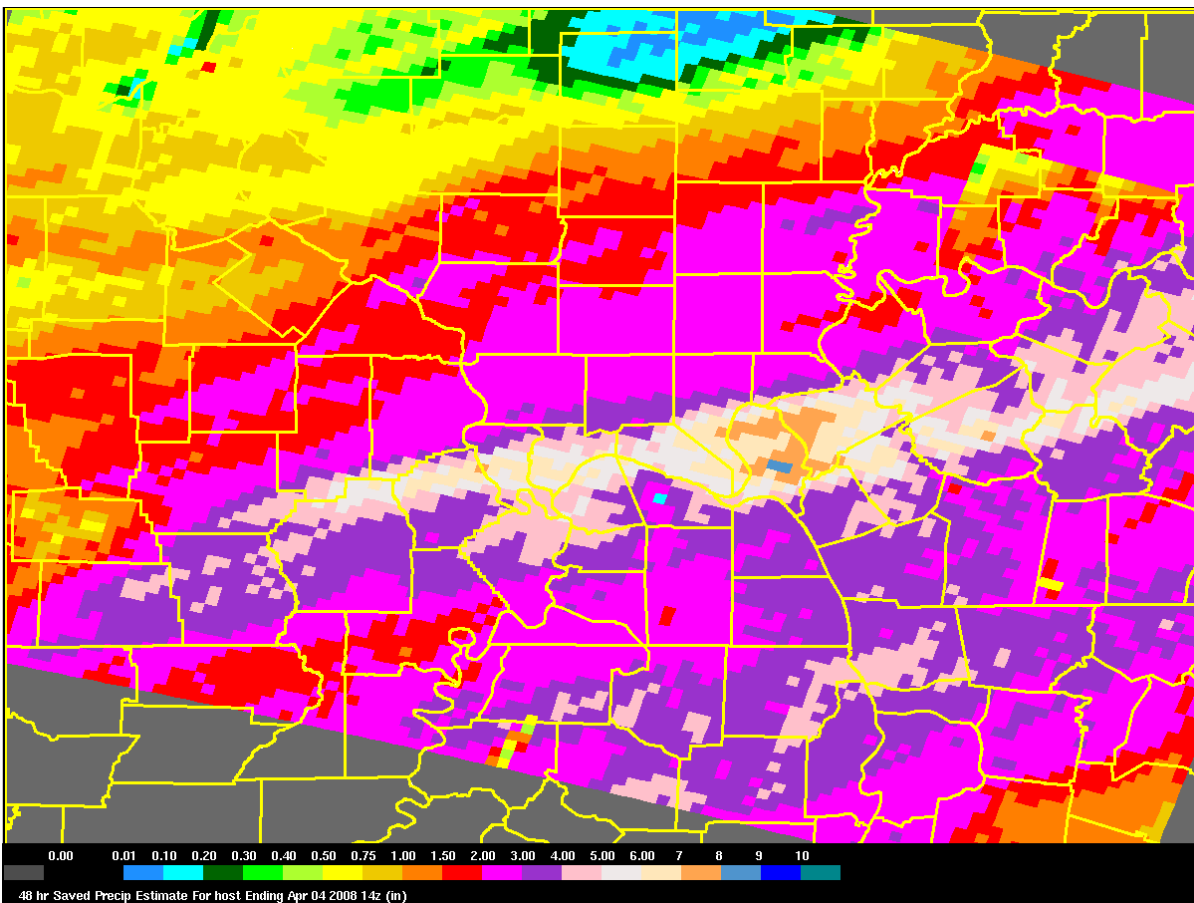


April 3rd Heavy Rain Event

Heavy rains pummeled the area once again Thursday into early Friday, adding insult to injury across already water-logged drainage basins. Generally speaking, 2 to 5 inches of rain fell in a 24-hour period ending at 7 am CDT Friday, April 4, 2008, with some locally higher observations exceeding 6 inches. The heavy rains caused numerous reports of flooding and closed some roads that were impassable just a few weeks ago during the major flooding event on March 18. While the water is receding in some areas, waters on area rivers will remain high for some time to come.

The image below represents an estimate of precipitation accumulation compiled by area Doppler radars. The precipitation accumulation is depicted over a 48-hour period ending at 9 am CDT on Friday, April 4, 2008.



Following is a tally of 24-hour rainfall totals from across the four-state region of southeast Missouri, southern Illinois, southwest Indiana, and western Kentucky as of Friday morning.

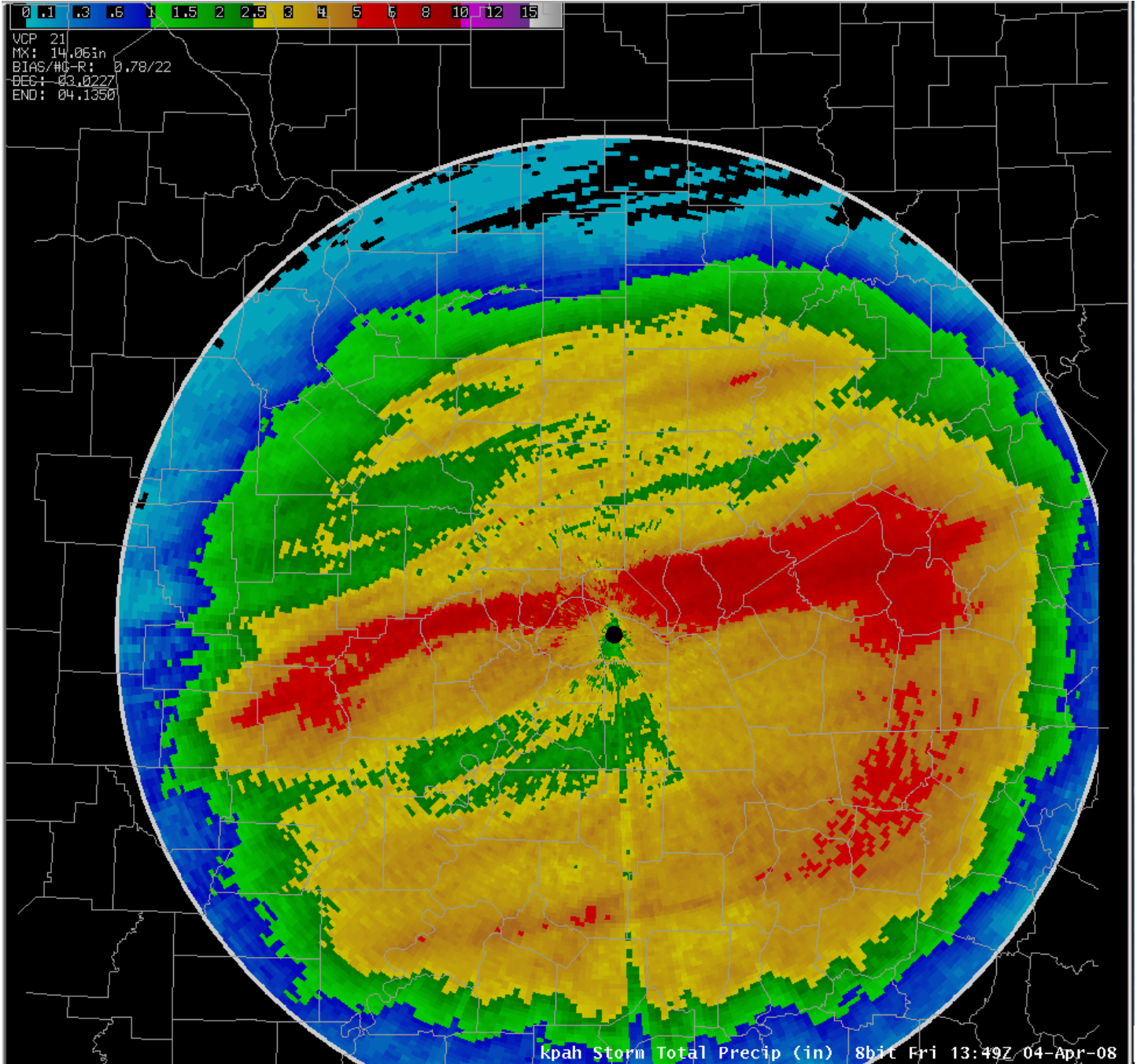
