Some of the higher reported snow amounts included: 5 inches near Monument (El Paso County)...6 inches near Pueblo and Beulah (Pueblo County)...7 inches near Walsenburg (Huerfano County)...8 inches near the summit of Wolf Creek Pass (Mineral County)...9 inches near La Veta (Huerfano County)...and 10 inches near the Spanish Peaks in Huerfano county.
