Summary Information

Updates to flood stages based on a review of impacts within this portion of the river. Additional impact statements added based on Florida DOT information and past flood events.

Impact Statements:

33.5 ft The US 129 bridge is overtopped at this level.

32.4 ft The approaches to the US 129 bridge on both sides of the river flood above this level.

31.7 ft Water begins to flood the road surface of the US 129 bridge.

31 ft In Suwannee County, 296th Street floods just west of US 129. An abandoned country store a quarter mile north of the bridge floods at this level.

30 ft In Suwannee County, homes south of River Run Road west of 45th road are surrounded by water. Significant flooding occurs at Sandy Point. Most buildings south of the entrance are flooded at or above this level.

29 ft In Gilchrist County, significant flooding occurs at Ellie Ray's Resort at the end of NW 110th street. Nearly all slots are flooded and the recreational building and pool are flooded. Access into the area is restricted west of NW 31st way.

28.1 ft Water reaches the base of the US-129 bridge. The bridge is subject to closure above this level.

28 ft At Sandy Point in Suwannee County, the restaurant is surrounded by water and flooding expands further across the campgrounds.

27 ft In Suwanee County, access to River Run Road west of 45th Road becomes restricted above this level.

26 ft Ellie Ray's Resort at the end of NW 110th street in Gilchrist County continues to flood. Water approaches the pool and several RV slots.

25 ft Water floods the backyards of homes off River Run Road in Suwannee County.

22 ft Water reaches the top of the bank and boat ramp at Ellie Ray's Resort at the end of NW 110th street in Gilchrist County.

20 ft The campgrounds at Sandy Point in Suwannee County begin to flood. Water floods the parking area on the east side of Sandy Point.

18 ft Boat ramps begin to flood along the Santa Fe River from the confluence with the Suwannee River upstream to River Run Road in Suwannee County.
