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- 1. <u>Purpose.</u> To promulgate National Weather Service (NWS) and Pacific Region Headquarters (PRH) policy on second-release of radiosondes at Pacific Region (PR) upper-air stations.
- 2. <u>Policy.</u> Upper-air observations support operational analysis and forecasting at local offices and national centers. A successful upper-air observation is when data is obtained up to the 400 Millibar (mb) level. When an upper-air observation fails to provide data up to the 400 mb level, a decision to attempt a second release is needed. Unnecessary second releases help conserve both funds and equipment without jeopardizing public safety.
- 3. <u>Procedure.</u> Specifically, when a routine upper-air flight fails to reach 400 mbs, the following shall be done:

a. <u>PR Upper-Air Stations.</u> Upper-air stations should contact the appropriate Weather Forecast Office (WFO) Senior Forecaster (SF) listed below and inquire if a second release should be attempted.

(1) WFO Honolulu (SF)	: (808) 973-5280	Lihue, Hilo, and Pago Pago.
(2) WFO Guam (SF):	(671) 472-0950	Guam, Koror, Yap, Chuuk, Pohnpei and Majuro.

b. <u>WFO Shift Senior Forecaster (SF)</u>. If the SF believes the local forecast/warning situation justifies a second release, they will authorize the release. If the SF believes the situation <u>doesn't</u> warrant a second release, the SF shall call the National Center for Environmental Predection (NCEP) Senior Duty Meteorologist (SDM) to let them know. If the SDM believes a second release is required for <u>national purposes</u>, the SF shall authorize the second release. Third releases <u>are not</u> authorized except under the most extraordinary circumstances.

4. <u>Documentation</u>. The upper-air station and WFO SF shall make an entry in their station logs documenting the decision and collaboration, if any.
