

National Weather Service Definitions for FLOODING


MINOR FLOODING - <u>minimal</u> or no property damage, but possibly some public threat or inconvenience.

MODERATE FLOODING - <u>some inundation</u> of structures and roads near streams/rivers; some evacuations of people and/or transfer of property to higher ground elevations necessary.

MAJOR FLOODING - <u>extensive</u> inundation of structures and roads; significant evacuations of people and/or transfer of property to higher elevations.



FLOOD ADVISORY /BE AWARE/ - issued when flooding is not expected to be bad enough to issue a warning. However, it may cause significant inconvenience, and if caution is not exercised, it could lead to situations that may threaten life and/or property.





National Weather Service Definitions for FLOODING

FLOOD WATCH /BE PREPARED/ - issued when conditions are favorable for flooding. It does not mean flooding will occur, but it is possible.

FLOOD WARNING /TAKE ACTION/ - issued when flooding is imminent or already happening.



FLASH FLOOD WARNING /TAKE ACTION/ - issued when flooding is imminent or occurring. A flash flood is a sudden violent flood that can take from minutes to hours to develop. It is even possible to experience a flash flood in areas not immediately receiving rain. Wireless Emergency Alert (WEA) is issued when a "Considerable" tag is used.

FLASH FLOOD EMERGENCY – Issued when a severe threat to human life and catastrophic damage from a flash flood is happening or will happen soon. Issuance is rare. Wireless Emergency Alert (WEA) is issued ("Catastrophic" tag).
