






U.S. Drought Monitor




New York State Mesonet - 30 Day Precipitation








New York State Mesonet - 60 Day Precipitation






New York State Mesonet - 90 Day Precipitation








New York State Mesonet - 120 Day Precipitation








New York State Snow Water Equivalent







Mar Apr May - Spring Seasonal Outlook




Spring Seasonal Outlook favors above normal temperatures and near to above normal precipitation.





Jun Jul Aug - Summer Seasonal Outlook




Summer Seasonal Outlook favors above normal temperatures and above normal precipitation.

Fall Seasonal Outlook favors above normal temperatures and near to above normal precipitation.







NWSChat 2.0 - Slack

What is NWSChat 2.0?

NWSChat 2.0 brings you virtually into National Weather Service (NWS) operations powered by Slack, as a real-time instant messaging program. This allows your local NWS office to communicate weather and flood information with key partners during incidents. It's an important situational awareness tool, leveraged by all members of the Integrated Warning Team: emergency management, news media and the NWS.

Who can use NWSChat 2.0?


- √ Members of the emergency management community including public safety officials from federal, state, tribal or local governments.
- √ Safety and emergency personnel from universities or other large-population entities.
- √ Members of the news media can relay weather. information such as flood watches, advisories, and warnings to a significant part of the population served by an NWS office.
- ✓ Government partners of a NWS office including (but) not limited to) the FAA, DHS, USGS, military and water and land management officials.











Why use NWSChat 2.0?

- √ Pictures and videos can be uploaded and shared in real-time with NWS forecasters.
- √ NWS products and storm reports can be displayed to maintain situational awareness.
- Information shared can be shared across the Integrated Warning Team and used by emergency managers to better communicate hazards to their communities.



- 5. Check your email for a welcome email from Slack
