The broadcast media and the Amarillo Emergency Operations Center reported that Interstate 27 was closed from Georgia Street to Hillside Road due to numerous stranded motorists in high water. Also, numerous high water rescues were performed all across central and southern Amarillo. No injuries were reported, however numerous vehicles were damaged due to the flash flooding.

Slow-moving thunderstorms over the same area and producing very heavy rainfall resulted in flash flooding across the south central Texas Panhandle during the evening hours. Numerous vehicles were stranded in the high water, however no injuries were reported. Also, downed power lines were reported at Bell Street and McCormick Road.

The Andy Michaels wildfire began around 1230 CST about four miles east of Channing Texas in Hartley County. The wildfire consumed a measured five hundred and two acres. Along with the Texas Forest Service, seven fire departments responded to the fire including Hartley...Boys Ranch...Channing...Dalhart...Sunray...Dumas and Vega. No homes or other structures were threatened by the wildfire and no damages or injuries were reported. The wildfire was contained at 1727 CST and then brought under control on 11/23/2010 at 1800 CST. The cause of the wildfire was determined to be of a suspicious nature.

The Ralston Wildfire began around 1516 CST and was contained around 1945 CST. The wildfire started about three miles southeast of Dalhart Texas in Hartley County and consumed three hundred and seventy acres. One home and three other structures were saved, however one structure was destroyed. There were no reports of injuries. The cause of the wildfire was determined to be from a vehicle on U.S. Highway 385 and U.S. Highway 87.
