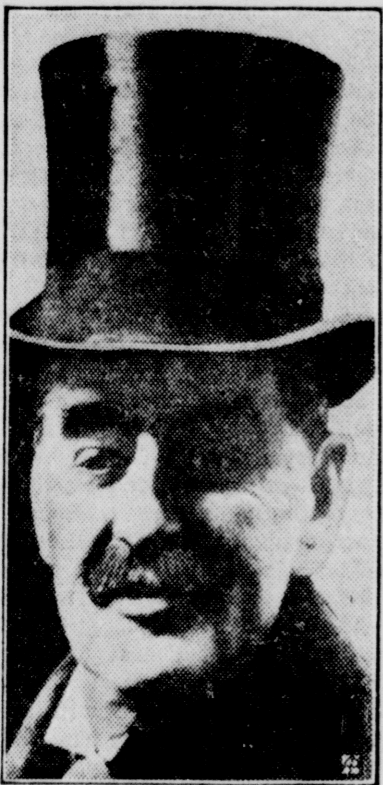

Treasury to Seek Billion New Revenue

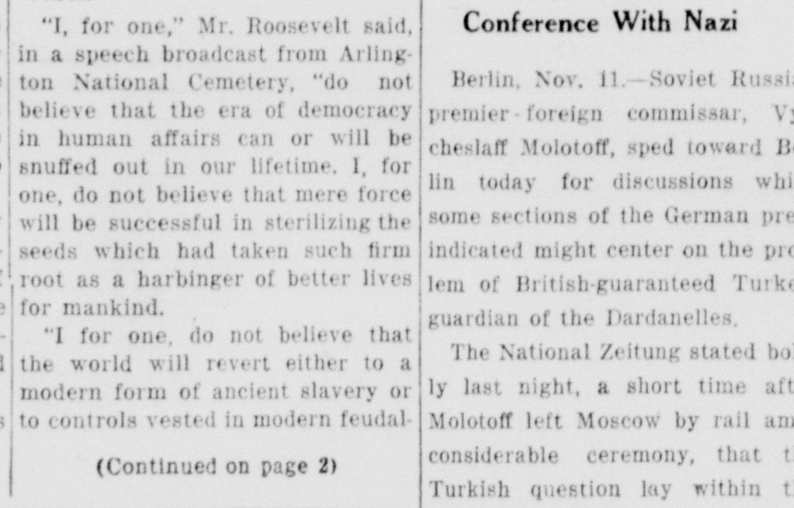
F.R. Voices Faith That Democracy Will Survive in Test
