



Accumulating Snow Wednesday Areawide

Winter Storm Watch Northern Oneida County

OVERVIEW

- Clipper system moves in early Wednesday morning with snow developing, and quickly overspreading the area.
- Accumulations will be elevation dependent as lower elevations warm up in the afternoon leading to a rain/snow mix or just rain.
- 7+ inches of snow possible over N. Oneida; less elsewhere but 1 to 4 inches expected areawide (locally 4"+).
- Potential for snow squalls Thursday with lake effect snow that follows this system.

TIMING	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• System moves in early Wednesday morning after a weaker clipper system impacts part of the region Tuesday afternoon and evening.
HAZARDS & IMPACTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Snow may result in slippery road conditions• Visibility will be reduced during heavier snow showers.• Snow rates 1-1.5"/hr expected in watch area
FORECAST CHALLENGES	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Temperatures Wednesday and whether that results in more snow or rain mixing in by the afternoon• Snowfall amounts, especially in higher terrain areas
NWS Alerts	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Winter Storm Watch in effect 4 AM Wednesday to 7am Thursday for N. Oneida• Monitor weather.gov/bgm for updates as other alerts may be needed





This map displays projected snowfall totals for a winter storm across New York State. The color scale on the right indicates snowfall amounts in inches, ranging from 0.1 (lightest blue) to 36 inches or more (darkest red). Major cities and locations marked on the map include Rochester, Syracuse, Utica, Albany, Binghamton, and others. Specific snowfall ranges are noted at various points, such as 6-13 inches near Boonville and 0.5-3 inches near Oswego. The map also shows major roads and geographical features like Lake Ontario.

A weak clipper brings an
inch or less of snow to
CNY between 3PM -
Midnight Tuesday

The next stronger system arrives with the majority of the snow falling on Wednesday; snow showers linger into Wednesday night across Central NY
