A strong low pressure system skirting across southern Saskatchewan and Manitoba Canada swept a fast moving cold front through western and central North Dakota producing strong westerly winds of 30 to 45 mph. Occasional gust over 55 mph were observed. The winds tapered off late in the afternoon and early evening.
