Low pressure quickly strengthened over the plains of Colorado and western Nebraska after it ejected out of the Rockies. The storm then lifted toward the northeast with moisture surging ahead of it. This allowed a period of freezing drizzle to develop over the Northern Plains ahead of the advancing storm. Snow and blowing snow developed over much of the region as the storm continued to the northeast. Heavy snow fell over southwest and south central North Dakota with the most, 15 to 16 inches, in Logan and McIntosh counties.
