Strong wind gusts developed as a cold front pushed through western and central North Dakota. The strongest winds occurred along and behind the front, especially in the vicinity of weak rain showers. The strongest wind gusts were estimated at 80 mph in McLean County where a large pole barn building collapsed in Wilton, and a camper was overturned near Garrison.
