TERRIBLE TORNADO IN ALABAMA.

A Planter's Son and a Negro Killed.

NEW YORK, March 13.—A special dispatch from Atlanta, Ga., reports a terrible tornado on the 8th instant in the southwestern part of Alabama. It first appeared upon the plantation of A. Grummett, in Tallapoosa county, completely demolishing every cabin. Grummett's son and a negro were killed by flying timber. The two ladies and a number of children in the house were caught under the roof, but all were rescued. Houses on several other plantations were demolished, but there was no other loss of life.

ASIA MINOR.

Troublesome Arabs and Starving People.

LONDON, March 13.—Advices have been received here from Smyrna giving a gloomy account of affairs in Asia Minor. The crops during the last season have been bad and many deaths from starvation have occurred, while destitution is on the increase, with a poor season for the crops in prospect. The authorities have petitioned the Government at Constantinople, but no satisfactory assurance of assistance has been received. The Arab tribes beyond Aleppo are very troublesome, and have been committing numerous depredations.

SHERMAN AND CAMERON'S SUCCESSORS.

When They Are to be Elected.
