A heat wave that began in July continued into early August. Heat index values climbed to 110 degrees or higher at Huntsville, Muscle Shoals and nearby communities on the 1st. Other areas reached at least 105 degrees. Temperatures reached or exceeded 100 degrees in some areas on the 3rd and 4th, and again from the 10th through 13th. Most areas reached or exceeded 95 degrees. Low temperatures only dipped into the upper 70s on most mornings during this period.

Heavy rainfall of totaling between 3 and 8 inches fell from near Hytop to just west of Stevenson and southward into Scottsboro. The hardest hit areas were in Scottsboro and just to its north, where between 5 and 8 inches of rainfall fell. This caused numerous roads in Scottsboro to be closed or barricaded as early as 6 am CDT. The Scottsboro airport recorded 4.59 inches of rainfall through 7 am CDT. By 740 am CDT, three feet of water was reported covering the Hardee's parking lot on Broad Street in Scottsboro. Two cars drove into a flooded ditch at this location and a walkway over the ditch was washed away.

Heavy rainfall continued in these areas through 9 am, causing extensive flash flooding. By 830 am, significant flash flooding was impacting residences on highway 79. Several water rescues had to be performed at residences near Maple avenue in Scottsboro by 9 am CDT. Additional flash flooding caused by the rainfall caused Dry Creek to overflow and cover a runway at the Scottsboro Airport with 3 to 4 inches of water. At this point 6.68 inches of rain was reported by a secondary weather station at the Scottsboro Airport. This total is suspected to be an underestimate.

A complex of heavy showers and thunderstorms developed around 5 am and tracked slowly northward through northeast Alabama. Thunderstorms and intense rainfall repeatedly regenerated over the same area, especially from Scottsboro northward through the Hytop area. Rainfall fell at a rate of one quarter inch per five minutes, or up to 3 inches per hour. The bulk of the rain fell from 6 am to 9 am, with rainfall totals of 6 to 7 inches reported. Flood water closed numerous roads in Scottsboro. Water as high as 4.5 feet inundated residences and businesses in the area. A few residents were rescued from the water in their homes. Two cars became submerged in flood water at a fast food restaurant on Broad Street where 3 feet was flood water collected.
