On the afternoon of Sunday, February 27th, a low pressure system developed in the Southern Plains, eventually tracking across the Tennessee Valley, well to the north of Alabama. In response to this low pressure, coupled by high pressure off the Atlantic Coast, southerly flow brought low 60 dew point temperatures as far north as Huntsville by 12 am Sunday night. By the late morning hours of Monday, February 28th, a secondary surface low developed and tracked across the northern half of the state of Alabama. This surface low created storms that began of a cellular nature by Noon on Monday. These cells evolved into a broken line of thunderstorms by the middle of the afternoon on Monday. Embedded in the line were storms that developed supercellular structures, a few of which spawned tornadoes and many areas of straight line wind damage. Click on each for a summary of the tornadoes.

A narrow band of heavy snow developed during the late afternoon and early evening hours of the 3rd across portions of north central into northeast Alabama, generally south of the Tennessee River. By mid evening, the snow changed to a mix of sleet and freezing rain which produced a light ice accumulation of a tenth of an inch or less on top of the snow. The snow reduced visibility to 2 miles or less, in some cases to 1/2 mile. Snow amounts of 2 to 5 inches fell in Marshall County, and 1 to 2 inches in portions of Cullman and DeKalb Counties. Lighter amounts of an inch or less fell in southern portions of Franklin, Lawrence, Morgan, Madison and Jackson Counties. By late evening into the overnight hours, temperatures slowly warmed to 32 to 34 degrees in valley areas, helping to improve road conditions.

Although much of the damage in Henry county was consistent with straight line winds associated with a line of thunderstorms, a small segment was determined to be associated with an EF0 tornado. This tornado began about one mile southwest of the intersection of Alabama State Highway 10 and County Road 57. The tornado continued intermittently for around 2 miles and ended to the north of Alabama State Highway 10 about 5 miles east of Abbeville. Damage with this tornado was limited primarily to numerous downed trees and roof damage to barns and outbuildings. This is consistent with DI 1 (Damage Indicator) and DOD 1 and 2 (Degree of Damage) on the EF (Enhanced Fujita) scale. The damage to personal property was estimated to be around \$95,000 according to the Emergency Manager with total damage expected to exceed \$150,000 including utility restoration. No injuries were reported.
